Our pulls are still chased by hand - each is unique. Chasing patterns are faithful copies of period patterns, and each tool is carefully handmade.






QA-1 Queen Anne Chased Pulls

Early style hand chased Queen Anne brass pulls. As with the originals, the chasing is done by stamping the design in with series of handmade punches and a hammer.

Our pulls are still chased by hand today-no two pulls are the same.

Later period Queen Anne chased pull. Why is it later? the more intricate shape of the plate is due to improvements in the production techniques of the era. Hand chased one at a time, as always. Available in all five bass finishes.
